Youth Suicide Prevention Program

Kelly McDonald graduated with her BS in Psychology as well as a Masters of Public Health from Oregon State University. Kelly has worked in suicide prevention for more than 10 years including with the US Army at Fort Lewis and Kitsap County Health District. She is also a certified ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training) instructor. She currently facilitates suicide awareness education and training for Washington State's Youth Suicide Prevention Program; a non-profit based out of Seattle, and is providing support to community groups in King County and to schools in the implementation of peer-to-peer suicide prevention education.



Rebecca Milliman, MSW

Rebecca Milliman, MSW, is the Prevention and Education Coordinator at Harborview Children's Response Center. She works with professionals, parents, and youth to create safer communities and enhance the protection of children from abuse and violence. She is a co-founder of the Violence Prevention Coalition and co-author of the F.L.A.S.H. (Family Life and Sexual Health) curriculum. Have you ever been concerned about a child's safety at home? At school? On the bus? At the bus stop? During the afternoon workshop, participants will learn more about child abuse and neglect: how to recognize, respond, and report. Participants will also have a chance to explore what role they have in violence prevention. We will brainstorm ways that school transportation providers can play an important role in keeping children safe physically and emotionally.

From Northbound I-405

- Exit 23 - Westbound SR 522 to Bothell
- Continue straight through the first signal
- At the second signal, veer left onto Bothell Way NE towards Seattle
- At the next signal, turn right at 180th
- At 92nd, a 4-way stop, turn right
- The theatre is on your left, on the campus of Bothell High School

From Southbound I-405

- Exit 26 - SR 527 Bothell/Mill Creek exit
- Turn right onto Bothell-Everett Highway
- Turn right at NE 188th St
- Turn left at 92nd Ave NE
- After a few blocks, the theatre will be on your right on the campus of Bothell High School

From Lake City/Bothell Way

- Drive toward Bothell on Bothell Way NE
- Turn left at 180th, a 4-way signal
- At 92nd, a 4-way stop, turn right
- The theatre is on your left, on the campus of Bothell High School
